- A living/learning environment for students belonging to fraternities and sororities with facilities
- A place where members who do not reside in the facility to socialize, study, etc. For commuters, to have a place to stay between classes, when they are participating in events and just to somewhat experience a living experience is important.
- Provides a sense of community (not only in the fraternal community, but in the institution as a whole.)
- Meeting spaces – it is often difficult and sometimes costly to reserve spaces for meetings and other on campus events.
- Study spaces (we hope!). Most facilities try to have a space or create a time frame where students can study.
- Memories such as spending time on the front porch, serenades, bid day photos with members and new members is so exciting when you have a place that you call home!
- Opportunity for collaboration – enhanced academic experience because you have others to share it with.
